

### **KS2 Christmas Productions**

Last year, following feedback from parents, we made a slight change to our KS2 Christmas. The decision was made to put on an Easter production in 3/4 and for the 5/6 children to continue with the Christmas production.

### The reasons for doing this:

- parents had expressed disappointment that some children only got to sing not to act.
- we felt that the growth in ks2 to 7 classes meant it was harder to give every child a meaningful part, or to organise them at church so all parents could see their child.
- the children wanted to be more involved in 'speaking parts' and so to make this possible we split into upper ks2 and lower ks2 for productions. This meant that we could concentrate on giving the children a better production 'experience' and for families to be able to really feel their child had been included in the performance.
- it also means as a Church of England school we can also celebrate Easter by doing this.

Logistically for the teachers and children, moving to this format is helpful, we can give the children a better experience and hopefully put on a quality performance for you all at home to see. We also feel that because the Y<sub>3</sub>/<sub>4</sub> children are performing at Easter they are not missing out, so everyone wins.

We have been contacted by a parent this week to express their disappointment at this arrangement and explaining how they feel the Y<sub>3</sub>/4 children will miss out. We apologise for that. However, through this explanation, we hope that you can appreciate why we have made this decision. We put getting the best opportunity and experience for the children first.

Thank you for your understanding in this. We welcome receiving feedback like this so we can have the opportunity to add detail to our information home, sharing with you our reasoning behind things. We only ever want to do the best by our/your children and we hope that you understand our reasons for this change. Thank you.



### **End of day procedures**

- 1. Children in key stage 2 are released and we do not hold lists. In year groups reception to year 2 we require a list of adults which you have given consent to allow your children to be released to. Even though we hold no such list in ks2 and there is no law to prevent children walking home alone, we do advise all children to be picked up where possible.
- 2. We do not release children in reception and KS1 to other children under 16, unless prior permission has been discussed with the Head.
- 3. If there are any changes to pick up arrangements, we require all messages to reception by 1pm. This allows time for the messages to be passed to classes. We ask that these are only in an emergency and any known changes are emailed to our office in advance.

Thank you, we appreciate your support in helping us to safeguard the children.

### Jump In! School Voucher Scheme

Bosses at a Shropshire trampoline park today launched a voucher scheme to give children the chance to win a free school trip.

'Jump In' Shrewsbury has launched its school scheme which will see bouncers collect a voucher to be handed in at their school or nursery. The class will be able to collect discount vouchers each time they attend a bounce session at the Henley Way venue and then the school can use them how they wish.

General manager Duncan Kemp said: "We know there are lots of national voucher schemes out there providing much-needed equipment for schools - but we believe giving children lots of experiences outside of the classroom is important in addition to everything they learn within school.

Carla Whelan, Headteacher of Oakmeadow Primary School in Bayston Hill was the first school to join the scheme.

"This is a great idea as children love collecting vouchers and for them to be rewarded with a free trip once they have collected enough is fantastic."

"It is trips like these that create very special memories. We must remember not all children are fortunate enough to be able to visit such venues at the weekends or during holidays so those who are fortunate enough will be giving their friends and peers the chance to experience the same."



# Sleepover





If your child is invited to a sleepover you will want them to be safe - both in general and in the event of a fire. So before you agree here are some things that might help.

### Check that your child:

 Is normally woken by and recognises the sound of a smoke alarm

> If they don't, or they have a hearing impairment or other disability, tell the sleepover parents so that someone must wake them and/or help them in an emergency

- Knows what to do if they hear a smoke alarm go off
- · Knows not to hide from fire
- Knows how to raise the alarm
- Is happy to ask about the escape plan of the place they are going to



Will tell you if they don't feel safe

### If you are in any doubt:

 Reverse the sleepover and invite the friend to your home instead

### And remember to:

 Go through your fire plan with any guests you have staying

### Check that:

- There will be a responsible adult present at all times in the property.
- There is a working smoke alarm.

Some of these questions may be uncomfortable to ask but why not look at it this way; you wouldn't dream of travelling in a car without seatbelts - they are lifesavers if there is an accident.

Working smoke alarms and escape plans are like seatbelts for sleepovers – you hope never to need them - but they must be there just in case...
