Dear Parent/Carer

As we head towards the Easter holiday periods, we would like to explain a potential scenario that we as a school community may face, given the current situation in relation to COVID19.

Under current Public Health England guidelines, anyone who has been in close contact with someone displaying COVID 19 symptoms within 48 hours of the onset of these symptoms, is required to self-isolate to prevent potentially spreading the virus.

As a school, this raises the possibility that if a child who was in school on the last day of term, subsequently displays any coronavirus symptoms over the weekend of the 3rd and 4th April and **then tests positive for COVID 19**, we, as a school, would have to contact the parents of pupils who have been in close contact with that pupil and ask them too self-isolate.

Clearly this is the last thing that anyone in our school community wants, so therefore please take the opportunity to remind your children of the importance of continued hand washing and hygiene measures, to minimise the risk of this situation happening.

Should your child become symptomatic <u>during the weekend of 3rd and 4th April please follow these</u> <u>steps:</u>

- 1. Email the dedicated address: <u>head@oakmeadowprimary.co.uk</u>
- 2. The school will contact all potentially affected parents of pupils by text and email, to advise them that a pupil has symptoms and to consider reducing their own child's contact with others.

- 3. Once the test result is known, contact school again via the dedicated email. This should be done whether the test result is positive or negative.
- 4. The school will contact parents of all potentially affected pupils again with the following instructions:
 - If a positive test result, affected students will be asked to self-isolate for ten days from Thursday 1st April 2021.
 - If a negative test result, no further action will be required.

Please bear in mind that it could be as late as Thursday 8th April before a test result is known.

We, like you, very much hope this situation does not arise, however, should we have to contact parents to advise them to self-isolate during the half term period, please understand this is our statutory obligation under the current Public Health guidelines and not something we would be doing unless absolutely necessary.

Thank you for your continued support and understanding during the current times.
