## Remote Education Provisional

**Please ensure you read this information about our Remote Educational Provision in case of self-isolation, bubble closure or lockdown.**

### What will be provided?

The remote education provision will be designed by Oakmeadow teachers and will use a curriculum sequence that allows access to high-quality teaching and learning. This will be linked to the school's curriculum expectations. When teaching pupils remotely, Oakmeadow curriculum designed lessons will be planned and well-sequenced so that knowledge and skills are built incrementally, with a good level of clarity about what is intended to be taught and practised in each subject. Teachers will plan a programme that is of equivalent length to the core teaching pupils would receive in school.

There will be a combination of 'live' lessons (for maths and English/ phonics), and pre-recorded lessons (for foundation subjects). The children will access the 'live' lessons through MS TEAMS using their personal login and password. If you cannot attend the 'live' lesson' you will be able to access the lesson through a recording on TEAMS after the session. All tasks will be assigned within MS TEAMS.

The pre-recorded lessons will be delivered through 'The Oak National Academy' for foundation subjects. The Oak National Academy is easy to use as there is no login or password. You can access the lessons on any device and pupils only need materials they can find at home. This is the hyperlink to take you to their website: <https://www.thenational.academy>.

Parents and carers will oversee their children's work. Children will be required to upload their work daily so that teachers can check work and know how well pupils are progressing through the curriculum. This will also enable teachers to address misconceptions, pace or difficulty of what is being taught, and where necessary, revise material to ensure our pupils develop secure understanding. Class teachers will be available online to support children with their learning. Feedback will be provided using whole class strategies, although some children might receive more targeted feedback as required.

Children will be set spelling and guided reading on Purple Mash, and they will use TTRS for times tables and number bonds. Furthermore, they will use Bug Club for daily reading.

There will be a weekly timetable uploaded each Sunday to ensure you have an understanding on how the week will progress and hopefully this will allow you to organise your time more effectively.

## Remote learning for whole school closure

### How will children access the live lessons?

Children from year 1 to year 6 will have two live lessons daily through MS TEAMS. EYFS will receive three live lessons as each lesson will be shorter. If they cannot attend the live lesson, they will be able to access a recording of the lesson on MS TEAMS.
