## Dear Home,

So far it has been a busy and successful few weeks into our autumn term, it was great to see the children at church this week (even though there were technical issues) and we would very much like to thank all homes for the food donation, these are going to the Food Bank in town. Thank you.

The start to the year has been very positive, observing in classes is a real privilege as I have watched the children growing in their learning, smiling, solving problems and challenging themselves each day. They really are a credit to homes, giving their best daily and persevering with their learning even if it's hard.

This year is also another year we are growing as a school, we have become a training school to deliver the NPQML (National Professional Qualification in Middle Leadership) and a Lead ITT school for the ALL (Teaching School).

It is a great privilege to have been accepted as there were high standards to meet in order to be considered and we are very proud of being able to be part of the team that supports future growth in our profession.

In addition to this, we have two members of staff training on the NPQML, two training on the NPQSL (National Professional Qualification in Senior Leadership) and I am completing the NPQEL (National Professional Qualification in Executive Leadership).

I feel this is a key indicator of the schools commitment to developing others and being part of a collaboration of growth. It also role models to our children that WE ARE LEARNERS TOO!

We have achieved above national attainment again this year in all our areas (GLD, Phonics, KS1 and KS2), although the results in KS2 are lower than last year, that particular cohort was expected to be lower than 2018.

Again this year we will be participating in another two successful residential visits (Pioneer Centre in Yr. 4 and Arthog in Yr. 6 – not to be missed), we will also be attending the Young Voices Festival again and going to the fabulous panto at Theatre Severn as a whole school later this term.

This is really a celebration of the commitment we have to enriching the curriculum, adding the extra to our learning opportunities and making our curriculum offer the best it can be.

We have now achieved the GOLD standard PE and SPORT award, moving up from silver. We have renewed our school Quality Mark, updated our Safer Schools Award and we are becoming a Dementia Friendly School this term too. If this wasn't enough, we are also supporting approximately 10 other schools in different areas of their work through SLE work and Associate Head work.

We wanted to share this with you to show you our commitment to not only develop ourselves and continuing to learn, but demonstrating the real passion & dedication for development and learning within our school. This means we can come in every day and do our best for your children.

We have had a very successful sporting year, winning over 5 football trophies, setting records at the Area Athletics Championships and in addition, many children have achieved musical grades.

We have welcomed a new Family & Children's worker from Christ-church, who is supporting us by adding to our worship provision (Jeanette) and this year we will be trying to organise a church residential too, so..... watch this space!






## **Harvest Festival**


Alzheimer's Society's Dementia Friends programme is the biggest ever initiative to change people's perceptions of dementia. It aims to transform the way the nation thinks, acts and talks about the condition.

We are delighted to say that on Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> October we will be welcoming a Dementia Friends Champion to school. Dementia Friends Champions are trained volunteers who encourage others to learn a little bit about dementia. Champions run Information Sessions in their community and inspire others to help those living with dementia live well.

He will be presenting age appropriate sessions to all children and staff in school from FS2 through to year 6 over the course of the day so that we can officially become a dementia friendly school.

We are in the process of extending the support we can offer locally as school, and will very shortly start holding outdoor learning sessions with a group of reception children from Bumblebees and members of the Beeches Medical Practice who are living with dementia. 

## We're improving your supply of wonderful water

### Why we're doing this work?

Every so often, we need to replace old water pipes, so we'll be in your area soon to do this. It does means that there'll be some short-term inconvenience — but the advantage of having brand new pipes will be worth it.

### When and where is the work taking place?

The work will start on the 23 September 2019 and will be ongoing until the 8 November 2019.

Please be aware that although we try to stick to these dates they may change due to circumstances beyond our control.

We'll start work on Hollies Drive and work down towards to the junction of Lansdowne Road where there will be **3 way traffic lights.** Once this section has been completed we will then move onto the top end of Hollies Drive towards the junction of Green Lane. We'll need to **close** this section of the road to through traffic. This closure will start on the **4 November 2019** until the **8 November 2019**. We're really sorry about this, but it will mean we keep everyone safe and get the work done as quickly as possible. You may see our team on site a few days earlier if they're setting up equipment, and our reinstatement team will be along once the work is finished to tidy up the roads and footpaths.

## Important things to know

Access to homes and businesses will be maintained at all times. There will be a signposted diversion route in place as you approach the working area from all routes and pedestrian access will be maintained at all times.

Please be assured that we, and our contract partner Heartlands, will be doing everything we can to minimise the disruption and get the work finished as quickly as we can. We're really sorry about any nuisance this causes but it's needed to keep everyone safe and get the work done as quickly as possible.

## Will my water supply be affected?


If we plan to interrupt your water supply we'll notify you in advance with a card stating the date and the earliest start and latest end time of the interruption. It's advisable to avoid using any appliances connected to the water supply during this period.

During or after the work, there's a small chance your water may appear discoloured. This is nothing to worry about, and will quickly go back to normal. We'll be doing our best to make sure your water supply is unaffected for the duration of our work.
