

If my bubble closes temporarily what will be provided?

The remote education provision will be designed by Oakmeadow teachers and will use a curriculum sequence that allows access to high-quality and offline resources and teaching videos. These will be linked to the school's curriculum expectations. When teaching pupils remotely, Oakmeadow curriculum designed lessons will be planned and well-sequenced so that knowledge and skills are built incrementally, with a good level of clarity about what is intended to be taught and practised in each subject. All lessons will provide frequent, clear explanations of new content, delivered by a teacher through high quality pre-recorded videos, which include animations, voice recorded and teacher annotations and modelling. All tasks will be within the assignment. Teachers will plan a programme that is of equivalent length to the core teaching pupils would receive in school. Parents and carers will oversee their children's work. Children will be required to upload their work daily so that teachers can check work and know how well pupils are progressing through the curriculum. This will also enable teachers to address misconceptions, pace or difficulty of what is being taught, and where necessary, revise material to ensure our pupils develop secure understanding. Class teachers will available online to support children with their learning. There will be a weekly timetable uploaded each Sunday to ensure so you have an understanding on how the week will progress and hopefully this will allow you to organise your time more effectively. Lessons are then scheduled daily so children can access the learning daily and help continue to have a routine of learning.

How will children access remote learning?

Children will access learning using either (which are currently in use with your homes):

- **Tapestry** – for **Nursery** and **Reception** children
- **Seesaw** for **Years 1 -5**
- **MS Teams** for **Year 6**.

Pupils that have provision maps will have some individualised learning uploaded to ensure that the curriculum being taught addresses their current educational needs and supports their progress.

If you would like to access non-core subjects such as history, art, geography etc., you can access additional lessons through Oak National Academy. This is an online classroom made by teachers, so that individual children can access additional remote education. In each of the online classrooms, there are numerous lessons. Each lesson is hour-long. They are delivered by a teacher, with a pre-recorded video as well as quizzes, worksheets, and creative activities. It is all easy to use, there is no login or password, you can access our lessons on any device, and pupils only need materials they can find at home.
